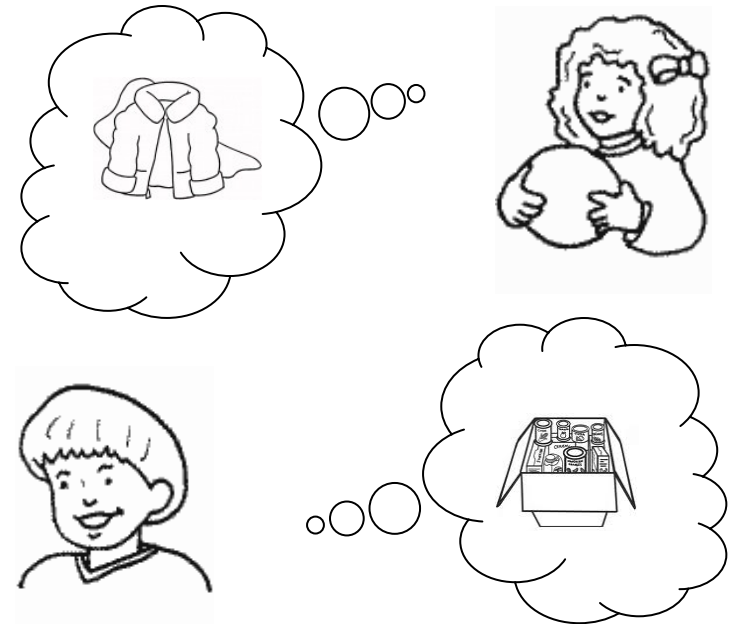

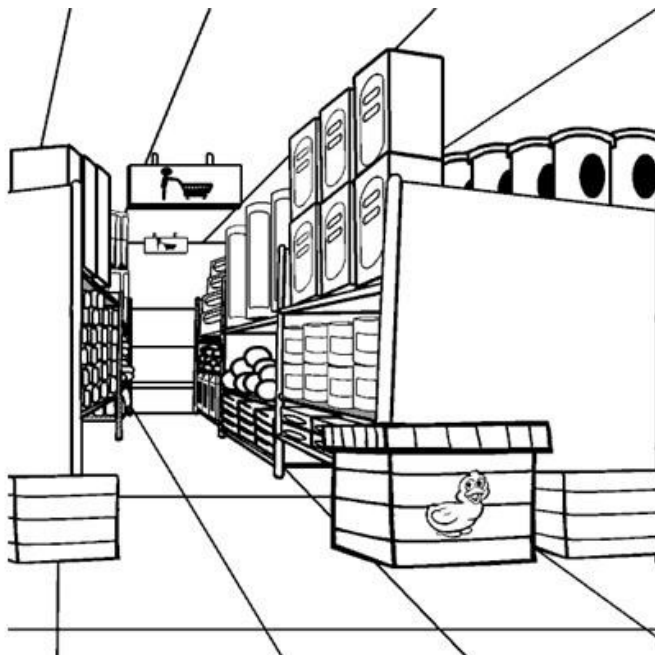

Have you ever been told you were too young to help? Well, guess what? There are so many ways you can help those in your community who have basic needs of food and clothing!

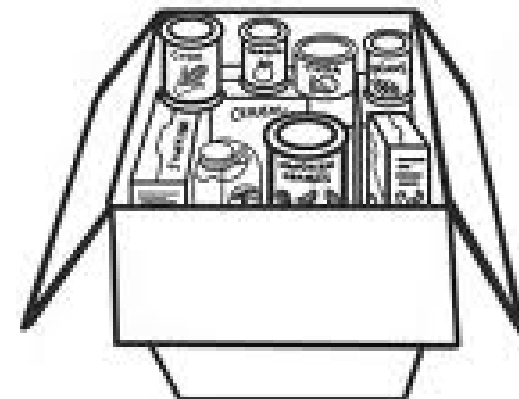

Remember the story of the Good Samaritan in the Bible? It's the one that tells of a Jewish man who had been robbed and left to die by the side of the road. Two different people pass by but offer no help to the man they see. But, here comes the Samaritan man. He sees the injured man, gives him food, clothing and a place to stay while he heals. The Samaritan didn't know the man, but he helped him anyway.

The Good Samaritan Ministries works in much the same way as the story. We try to help those who need it by providing food and clothing.

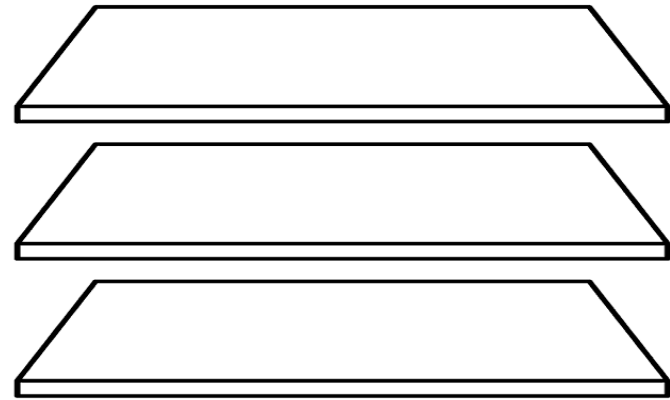
Take the time to think about some ways you can share with others and list them below. Talk them over with your mom and dad and decide as a family what you'd like to do!
